Butlins Holiday Resort is again the chosen venue for the Rochester Diocesan Conference. Accommodation will be in single rooms in two or three bedroom apartments, each with a lounge with TV, a Kitchenette, and a Toilet and Shower. Double or twin rooms are also available for couples. Plenary sessions will be held in the major venues at Butlins, whilst workshops will be held in various venues around the site, many of which have been significantly upgraded since our last visit. All meals will be taken together in the main dining room, and additional facilities available on the site include all-weather sports courts, cinema, supermarket, bars and pubs, internet café, launderette, and post box.

The full cost of the conference is £288 per delegate. This fee includes attendance at the conference and full board. A deposit of £50 per delegate is required to secure your place. The balance of the cost must be paid by 1st October 2008. Cheques should be made payable to "Rochester DBF"

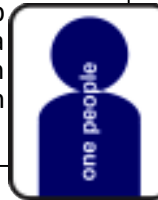

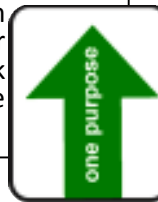
